



SciFest Kerry— Innovation and sustainability award winners


Congratulations to 5th year students Matteo Medici, Francesco Masia and Alessandro Serra who won the the innovation and sustainability award at Kerry SciFest.

What new subjects did you study in TY?


In TY we studied three new subjects. "Technology" which is essentially a mix between an engineering class and an IT class. "DCG" which would be like "Tech Graph" but as well as doing the technical drawing you also spend time on apps like "Solid works" where you design and model elements on the laptops. The last new subject we studied in TY was "Future Leaders" which is something ran by the GAA where you go in depth about the history of the GAA, nutrition, planning events, training and coaching and a whole lot more.
