#### TRANSITION YEAR

The Transition Year class have been very busy both academically and with extra-curricular activities so far this year. Transition year is a great opportunity for students to explore new subjects and new experiences. In St. Patrick's Secondary school we offer some unique modules where students can explore different types of learning and experiences. These modules include, GAA Future Leaders, Community Care, Design and Technology and Climate Detectives. Transition year students are also involved in an e-learning course with IACT (The International Academy of Computer Training). This is a fully certified course where students complete three modules. The modules cover driver safety, computer skills and hospitality skills. Transition Year students also get to experience different workshops and trips throughout the year such as, The Eclipse Adventure Centre, Bernard Casey Workshop, Road Safety Workshop, Hiking Trip and Special Effects Workshop. Due to a partnership with Presentation Secondary School, Transition Year students also get an opportunity to learn and go on trips in a mixed gender setting.

#### TY CLIMATE DETECTIVES

Transition Year students are engaging with a STEM Pilot Project in conjunction with the PDST and the ESERO. Climate Detectives is a European project for students between the ages of 8 and 19 run by the European Space Agency (ESA) and the national European Space Education Resource Offices (ESEROs). Teams of students identify and investigate a climate problem in their locality. They use data from ground measurements and/or data from remote sensing platforms, such as Earth observation satellites, to explore the climate problem they have identified. As part of this Pilot, students visited Cork Marts and Moorepark on Thursday the 27th of October. Here they got to see some climate action projects and chat to scientists who were conducting these studies.

We have had a very successful year on the football field so far this year. Aswell as winning the Moynihan Cup the Senior footballers have reached the Shane Ó Murchú Munster Cup semi-final beating, Ballingcollig Community School, Beara Community School and Mary Immaculate Dunmanway. Our u16 basketballers won a first South-West 'A' title for the school since 2015 when they overcame the stern challenge from Rathmore in the recent League final. Both sides met in the All Ireland Junior (2nd Year Final) earlier this year and on that occasion the impressive Rathmore side captured the All-Ireland title. Having topped our group with three impressive victories over Gaelcólaiste Ciarraí, Mercy Mounthawk and CBS, The Green Tralee we advanced to meet St. Brendan's, Killarney in the League semi-final winning out by 10 points. In the Final we faced a stern challenge from a Rathmore side who had also topped their group en route to the final. We held a four-point advantage at the end of the opening quarter, stretching that to fifteen at the interval. Our lads showed great composure in the 3rd quarter to see off the early Rathmore fight to go into the final quarter with a fourteen-point lead. In the final quarter the players managed the game excellently. Despite our lead being reduced to six with four minutes to go the lads rebounded from the disappointment of last seasons All Ireland final defeat

to emerge victorious with a ten-point victory to capture the South-West 'A' title and advance to the last 16 of the All Ireland Championship against Coláiste Mhuire Crosshaven in January.

Captain David Healy accepted the trophy while Ruairi Brosnan was awarded finals MVP following an excellent display. Congrats to our u-16 Basketball team on winning the "A" grade League Cup! A tough game versus an excellent team from Rathmore. St Pats winning 44-34 in the end.


